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
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

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WAH-TUT-CA SCOUT RESERVATION

Wah-Tut-Ca Scout Reservation 292 Blakes Hill Road Northwood, NH 03261

The above address can be entered into your GPS. If you prefer to go old school and use conventional directions, those can be found below.

DIRECTIONS

Take I-93N to Exit 15E in Concord, New Hampshire. Take I-393 East to Route 4 East. Take Route 4 East to the traffic rotary in Epsom, about 8 miles from I-93.

Continue East on Route 4 into Northwood, NH.

Turn right onto Blake's Hill Road, about 7 miles from the rotary. The camp entrance is approximately 1 1/2 miles on the right.



DATE AND TIME

The Arrow of Light Weekend will be from September 22nd, 2017 at 6:30 PM until September 24th, 2017 until camp closes at 11:00 AM.

ARRIVAL

Please arrive at Wah-Tut-Ca on Friday night between 6:30 PM and 8:00 PM. Registration will not be opened and we will not be ready for units until 6:30 PM. It is important for units to arrive before 8:00 PM to allow time to set up gear before the opening campfire.

When you arrive, there will be Arrowmen and signs to direct you on where to park, drop off your gear, and where to check-in. Event parking at Wah-Tut-Ca is limited. Due to this, and to be conservation minded, we strongly encourage carpooling.

GEAR

See pages 9 and 10 for a packing list of personal and den gear.

Upon arriving at Camp you will be sent to a designated parking and gear drop off area. Please come prepared to hike your personal gear to your assigned campsite. Trucks will also be available to shuttle den gear such as food and tents. You will not be able to drive your car all the way to your campsite. Please pack your food and gear appropriately so it can be shuttled to your campsite. Coolers or Rubbermaid containers work well. Shopping bags from the supermarket do not. Food should be protected against weather and animals. This event takes place at camp in its off season and therefore is a "carry in, carry out" facility.

MEDICAL FORMS/SPECIAL ACCOMODATIONS

A health history form is required for all participants and should remain in the possession of the Den Leader. Parts A and B are required for this weekend (<u>http://www.scouting.org/filestore/</u><u>HealthSafety/pdf/680-001_AB.pdf</u>) This does not require a physical exam.

Registration for the Arrow of Light Weekend is done online at OAPennacook.org/AOL. Units will pay for the event ahead of time, allowing a more seamless and quick check-in.


During the check in on Friday night your den will be assigned to a campsite and an Arrowman guide will assist you and help you set up.

- Saturday Lunch


The den is responsible for purchasing these meals and any snacks; and preparing them in the campsite. Meal planning should be part of the camping experience. Involve your Webelos in creating the menu, creating a budget, purchasing food, cooking, and cleaning up.

Remember to store your food and trash responsibly to avoid uninvited guests and spoilage.

DINING HALL MEALS

Dinner on Saturday night is provided in the Wah-Tut-Ca dining hall in a Boy Scout Camp style meal. Dinner is meat with gravy, macaroni and cheese, vegetable and dessert surprise. Breakfast on Sunday morning will be a rolling breakfast that will consist of fruits, yogurts and danishes. 






- Class "A" Webelos Uniform
- Webelos Handbook
- Tent & Ground cloth
- Backpack or Appropriate bag to carry gear
- Weather appropriate clothes
 (sweatshirt, rain coat, windbreaker, puffy goose down winter coat, gloves etc.)
- Water bottle or camelback (lots of water)
- Plate/Bowl/Mess kit (eating utensils)
- Sturdy shoes
- Rain Gear
- Sun block
- Bug spray
- Rope (a Scout always comes prepared with rope.)
- Flashlight/Headlamp (It will be getting dark when you are setting up your campsite).
- Hat
- Small notebook and pen
- Enthusiasm

We highly reccomend that all gear is labeled with your name and unit number in the event that it gets lost or misplaced.





- Rain or dining fly
- Rope
- Trash Bags (Trash must be hauled out and discarded at home)
- Food for Weekend in appropriate containers (may require coolers) Food containers must be animal proofed!
- Camp Stove if required to prepare food
- Cook kit and Utensils to prepare food
- Containers to Carry Water

Check with your local Boy Scout troop for the possibility of borrowing camping gear; most troops will gladly accommodate a Webelos Den or Cub Scout Pack when it comes to camping. They should have tents and outdoor cooking gear.

We highly reccomend that all gear is labeled with your unit number in the event that it gets lost or misplaced.

Drinking water, flush toilets, latrines, and showers will be available in the camp. Trash must be hauled out and discarded at home. Camp dumpsters cannot accommodate the volume of trash for this event. This event takes place at camp in its off season and therefore is a carry in, carry out facility.
