



ADULT NOMINATION FORM FOR MEMBERSHIP

Each year, upon holding a troop or team election for youth candidates that result in at least three youth candidates being elected, the unit may nominate registered unit adults (age 21 or over) to the Lodge Adult Selection Committee. The number of adults nominated can be no more than one-third of the number of youth candidates elected, rounded up where the number of youth candidates is not a multiple of three. Regardless of the one-third limit, the unit may nominate the currently-serving unit leader, (but not assistant leaders), as long as he or she has served as unit leader for at least the previous 12 months. Nominees recommended by the Adult Selection Committee, with the approval of the Lodge Adviser and Scout Executive, will become candidates for induction, provided all conditions are fulfilled, and be invited to participate fully in an upcoming Ordeal Weekend.

To be eligible, the adult must have completed 15 days and nights of Boy Scout camping during the two-year period prior to nomination. The 15 days and nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisting of six consecutive days and five nights of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the BSA. The balance must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps. Include above the dates and location of the resident camping experience.
