
"Old Main" in the late 19th century






Did you know?

Logistics, General Schedule

- > Flying out of Boston on Sunday, July 28 to Denver
- Attending NOAC at University of Colorado Boulder from July 29 - August 3
- Side trips from August 3 August 10: Philmont Scout Ranch, Rocky Mountain National Park, Native American Historic Sites, USAF Academy, and more.
- > Overnights at Scout camps in Colorado & New Mexico
- > Flying home from Denver on Saturday, August 10



Pennacook's Contingent '24

- Full contingent goal:
 36 youth (21 & under) + 8 adults = 44 delegates
- (3) 15-passenger vans to be rented for the second week's side trip adventures to Philmont, Rocky Mountains, etc.
- 2 youth per van, 2 adult drivers per van
- Adults interested in attending must contact the Lodge Adviser before registering as certain eligibility criteria will apply for adult attendees, including Philmont physical health requirements. Adults are also welcome to attend NOAC as event staff independent of the Lodge Contingent or may attend NOAC for the conference week only.

National Conference Fee Structure

The conference fee itself is \$675.00 per person/delegate and is included in the total cost for the trip.

Delegate conference fees are paid through the Lodge/Council contingent and includes the promotion patch (delivered after receiving your paid deposit), the conference patch, residence hall housing, 14 meals starting with Monday dinner & ending with Saturday breakfast, program materials, and credentials for access to all conference trainings, programs and shows.



Total Cost Breakdown

- NOAC fee (conference week)	\$ 675
- Airfare (estimated at Nov 1)	\$ 790
- Van Rental	\$ 200
- Side Trips	\$ 400
- Meals	\$ 525
- Lodging (CO, NM area scout camps)	\$ 150
- Lodge Apparel/SWAG	\$ 110
Total -	\$2,850



Timeline for NOAC Payments

- ➤ October 15 Lodge NOAC Announcement (Zoom)
- Beginning December 1 \$100 non-refundable deposit due with contingent registration
- January 15 \$800 payment #2 due (to secure airline tickets)
- March 1 \$500 payment #3 due
- April 20 \$800 payment #4 due
- ➤ June 1 balance due, payment #5



Fundraising & OA Scholarship Opportunities

(for youth only; youth may apply for multiple scholarships)

- Trip fundraising involving <u>all</u> attendees and sponsors with goal to raise \$14,000 to be applied to total trip cost to lower <u>all</u> participating attendees' individual fee (est) to \$2,500
- National OA Trailblazer Scholarship, application due by January 31, 2024 (awardees to be notified by National OA by March 15)
- Pennacook & Spirit of Adventure hosted Founders Scholarships: Ceremonialist Competitors, First Year Members, Pennacook Promising Leaders, Flintlock & West Wind communities
- Key Foundation's Patrick Doyle NOAC Scholarships
- Scholarship awards typically range between \$100 \$800
- Pennacook Bowl-a-Thon in March 2024 for individual fundraising
